ETHICS

When questioning if you have the right to use a photo for a school project, A good rule of thumb to go by is; if it isn't yours, make sure to cite it! Put the link that leads to the online photo in your bibliography (or in some other way make sure to hand it in when you turn in your project) -- you can never cite TOO much; people only get into trouble when citing too little.
